

San Francisco Transit Riders (SFTR) represents the hundreds of thousands of daily transit riders in San Francisco.



### What inadequate funding means for riders

- The most transit-dependent and lowest income transit riders will be impacted first and worst:
  - Service cuts
  - Fare increases
  - Service disruptions
  - Negative impacts to cleanliness, safety, and comfort



"I'm a senior, and I don't want to be trapped at home.

Reliable bus service lets me attend cultural events and classes, and to participate in the wider community."





"As a car-free family of 4, we rely heavily on Muni to get to work, school, and extracurricular activities. [...] Less Muni means more traffic, making biking more dangerous and driving more tedious."

"As a SF resident without a car, I rely on transit to get around the city, visit local businesses, and see friends. Cutting funding would prevent me from doing these things."







"I solely rely on transit (or walking) and am suffering the loss of the 10 which **got me to my doctors in half the time** [...] and am too frequently left with no options at night"

## Community outreach: Transit Justice Coalition

#### Community feedback:

- Service should be:
  - Complete, frequent, fast, reliable, comfortable, accessible at all hours, and accommodating of multimodal trips
- Transit should be safe and affordable– all should feel welcome and no one should be turned away for lack of funds
- Suggestions for increasing accessibility, especially for non-English speakers and riders with disabilities



## Accountability from the riders' perspective

- Communities want and need better transit.
- Many improvements are broadly supported by our communities, but will require additional funding to implement.
- Transit should be funded to survive the fiscal cliff and "thrive" beyond the pre-pandemic status-quo
- Riders must be included in discussions about transit's future, including any discussions about "accountability" from transit agencies
