### Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 250, as it passed the Senate, prohibited a statement, as defined, from a person who is subject to immunity from prosecution under a specified provision of existing law, from being used as evidence in a criminal proceeding against the person for the crime of being under the influence of, or possessing for personal use, a controlled substance, controlled substance analog, or drug paraphernalia, if specified circumstances were satisfied.

The Assembly amendments delete these provisions.

SB 250, as it passed the Senate, provided that it is not a crime for a person to possess for personal use a controlled substance, controlled substance analog, or drug paraphernalia, if the person, after testing, determines that the controlled substance or controlled substance analog is adulterated with another substance and the person notifies law enforcement of the positive test and the individual from whom the person obtained the substance.

The Assembly amendments revise the conditions for the above exemption to instead require the person to deliver the controlled substance or controlled substance analog to the local public health department or law enforcement and notify them of the likelihood that other batches of the controlled substance may have been adulterated with other substances.
