The Assembly amendments exempt this disclaimer requirement for certain content, including content already requiring a disclosure pursuant to existing law, content posted on the committee's own website, profile, or landing page by a person compensated by the committee to post such content, and content posted by a compensated employee of a committee on the employee's own social media page or account, as specified.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 885, as it passed the Senate, revised the Teachers' Retirement Law to authorize the State Teachers' Retirement System (STRS) to collect specified criminal history information for employees of STRS and each applicant for employment.

SB 885 revised portions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law (PERL) to remove the Public Employees' Retirement System's (PERS) board of administration's option to charge interest at the annual return on the system's investments for the year prior in which payments are not timely made. SB 885 authorized an employer participating in the California Employers' Pension Prefunding Trust Program to request a disbursement of funds from the California Employers' Pension Prefunding Trust Fund and transfer those funds directly into the Public Employees' Retirement Fund.

The Assembly amendments would additionally revise portions of the PERL to require a member to be provided an election to withdraw contributions, or, if vested, an election to either apply for service retirement or to withdraw contributions, at the age specified by federal law.

SB 885 revised portions of the Judges' Retirement System II (JRS II) to allow under an option settlement 1, if there is no surviving spouse, for the judge's remaining contributions to be paid to a designated beneficiary at death.

The Assembly amendments would additionally revise portions of the Judges' Retirement Law to change the age for required distributions from 72 years of age to the age specified by federal law. SB 885 would additionally make various changes to JRS II to grant a judge additional benefits and options upon retirement.

SB 885 revised portions of the County Employees Retirement Law of 1937 (CERL) to clarify the definition of final compensation for specified members. SB 885 also clarified the notice a board shall provide to a member of the system and revised the age at which the retirement system is required to either start payment of an unmodified retirement allowance or make a one-tie distribution of accumulated contributions and interest.

The Assembly amendments would also change the date PERS and STRS are

SB 250, as it passed the Senate, prohibited a statement, as defined, from a person who is subject to immunity from prosecution under a specified provision of existing law, from being used as evidence in a criminal proceeding against the person for the crime of being under the influence of, or possessing for personal use, a controlled substance, controlled substance analog, or drug paraphernalia, if specified circumstances were satisfied.

The Assembly amendments delete these provisions.

SB 250, as it passed the Senate, provided that it is not a crime for a person to possess for personal use a controlled substance, controlled substance analog, or drug paraphernalia, if the person, after testing, determines that the controlled substance or controlled substance analog is adulterated with another substance and the person notifies law enforcement of the positive test and the individual from whom the person obtained the substance.

The Assembly amendments revise the conditions for the above exemption to instead require the person to deliver the controlled substance or controlled substance analog to the local public health department or law enforcement and notify them of the likelihood that other batches of the controlled substance may have been adulterated with other substances.
