

I am returning Senate Bill 275 without my signature.

This bill would require appointment of the State Oil and Gas Supervisor to be subject to Senate confirmation. I share the Legislature's desire for appointments to be made effectively and transparently, especially when considering California's ambitious and time-sensitive clean energy and carbon neutrality goals.

However, an appointee to this position already undergoes an extensive and exhaustive identification, evaluation, and selection process, a process that ensures the appointee is experienced and fully capable of carrying out our shared policy objectives of protecting public health, safety, and the environment. Additionally, this position falls under the direction and oversight of the Director of Conservation, a gubernatorial appointee that is subject to Senate confirmation.

For these reasons, I am returning this bill without my signature.

The Assembly amendments also require that at least once per year, at least a quorum of the members of the eligible legislative body participate in person from a singular physical location that is open to the public and within the boundaries of the eligible legislative body.

SB 413, as it passed the Senate, also indefinitely extended the application of a provision that expired on July 1, 2019, requiring the county board of education in a class 2 county to make a determination within 45, instead of 30, calendar days after a parent appeals the school district's decision regarding a request for interdistrict transfer and the applicable period of attendance.

The Assembly amendments instead authorize the county board of education in a class 1 or class 2 county to extend the otherwise applicable 30-day time period to up to 60 calendar days after the parental appeal is filed to determine whether the pupil should be permitted to attend the school district of proposed enrollment and the applicable period of attendance, if one or more circumstances related to delayed responses, requests for delay, or the closure of certain annual application windows apply.

The Assembly amendments require the City of Laguna Woods to complete the capital improvements identified in the plan within 3 years of the department's approval of the plan. The Assembly amendments also add a coauthor.

The Assembly amendments instead prohibit the Exchange from disclosing information to any entity without the consent of the applicant, except as specified. The Assembly amendments authorize the Exchange to disclose information obtained from the EDD to outreach and marketing vendors under contract to the Exchange. The Assembly amendments require the Exchange to ensure that information disclosed to any entity complies with applicable privacy and information securityrelated requirements arising under federal and state law and is destroyed in a manner that maintains confidentiality.

SB 669, as it passed the Senate, authorized a veterinarian to allow a registered veterinary technician to act as an agent of the veterinarian for the purpose of establishing the veterinarian-client-patient relationship to administer preventive or prophylactic vaccines or medications for the control or eradication of apparent or anticipated internal or external parasites by satisfying specified criteria, including, among others, a requirement that, if the registered veterinary technician is working at a location other than a registered veterinary premises, the veterinarian is in the general vicinity.

The Assembly amendments would instead require, if the registered veterinarian technician is working at a location other than a registered veterinary premises, that the veterinarian is in the general vicinity or is available by telephone and is quickly and easily available, and that the location has equipment and drugs necessary to provide emergency care, as specified. The Assembly amendments would additionally require the registered veterinary technician, at any location, to inform the client that the registered veterinary technician is acting as an agent of the veterinarian and to record the client's authorization to proceed in the animal patient's medical record.

The Assembly amendments remove the above-specified activity as a type of discrimination that is prohibited.

The Assembly amendments delete the contents of SB 808, except for the legislative findings and declarations, and instead require the California State University, on or before December 1 of each year, to submit a report to the Legislature on the investigations and outcomes of sexual harassment reports and formal sexual harassment complaints, as provided, and require the California State University to post these annual reports on its internet website.
