However, an appointee to this position already undergoes an extensive and exhaustive identification, evaluation, and selection process, a process that ensures the appointee is experienced and fully capable of carrying out our shared policy objectives of protecting public health, safety, and the environment. Additionally, this position falls under the direction and oversight of the Director of Conservation, a gubernatorial appointee that is subject to Senate confirmation.

For these reasons, I am returning this bill without my signature.

The Assembly amendments also require that at least once per year, at least a quorum of the members of the eligible legislative body participate in person from a singular physical location that is open to the public and within the boundaries of the eligible legislative body.

SB 786, as it passed the Senate, prohibited a pharmacy benefit manager from discriminating against a covered entity or its pharmacy in connection with dispensing a drug subject to federal pricing requirements or preventing a covered entity from retaining the benefit of discounted pricing for those drugs. SB 786, as it passed the Senate, listed the types of discrimination that are prohibited, including, among other things, requiring a covered entity or specified pharmacy to identify, either directly or through a third party, covered drugs or covered drug costs.

The Assembly amendments remove the above-specified activity as a type of discrimination that is prohibited.

The Assembly amendments delete the contents of the bill and instead require the Department of Cannabis Control, no later than March 1, 2024, to allow a cultivation licensee to change the type of size of a cultivation license or to place a cultivation license in inactive status, as specified. The Assembly amendments also require the department, in implementing these provisions, to allow each licensee a one-time opportunity to change the date of license renewal.

SB 256, as it passed the Senate, authorized the City of Davis to convey conservation easements, leases, or licenses for habitat conservation projects on 8 specified parcels acquired by the city with a grant made pursuant to the California Wildlife, Coastal, and Park Land Conservation Act, and for the sequestration of carbon dioxide in the pore spaces in the geologic reservoir located below 3 of those parcels.

The Assembly amendments authorize the city to convey conservation easements, leases, or licenses for the geologic storage, rather than the sequestration, of carbon dioxide in those pore spaces, as specified. The Assembly amendments additionally authorize the city to convey conservation easements, leases, or licenses on the 8 parcels for agricultural activities that provide wildlife habitat, and would require any revenue received by the city from conveying any of these easements, leases, or licenses to be used to preserve, protect, maintain, or enhance wildlife and riparian habitat, wetlands, and potential wetlands within the Davis Planning Area, as specified.

SB 280, as it passed the Senate, required the care plan to be delivered to specified persons, including the conservatee's spouse or registered domestic partner and relatives within the first degree.

The Assembly amendments lower the maximum penalty to \$500 and create an exception for delivery to the conservatee's spouse or registered domestic partner and relatives within the first degree if the court determines delivery will result in harm to the conservatee.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 403, as it passed the Senate, revised provisions of the Unruh Civil Rights Act regarding free and equal access to accommodations, advantages, facilities, privileges, or services, to specifically entitle persons to those rights regardless of their caste, as defined. SB 403, as it passed the Senate, included caste as a protected characteristic in a policy statement relating to public schools. SB 403, as it passed the Senate, prohibited discrimination based on caste in programs or activities conducted, operated, or administered by the state or a state agency, or that receives any state financial assistance. SB 403, as it passed the Senate, also revised the California Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA) to prohibit discriminatory employment and housing practices because of caste. SB 403, as it passed the Senate, included legislative findings on caste discrimination in various settings, including the workplace and school settings.

The Assembly amendments instead revise the Unruh Civil Rights Act provisions to define "ancestry" for purposes of that act to include, among other things, caste, as defined. The Assembly amendments also revise the policy statement related to public schools to include ancestry as a protected characteristic and define "ancestry" and "caste" for purposes of those provisions. The Assembly amendments remove the provision that prohibits discrimination based on caste in state-related programs or activities and revise the language in FEHA to instead define "ancestry" to include "caste," as further defined. The Assembly amendments incorporate additional changes to a provision that would become operative only if SB 403 and AB 524 are enacted and SB 403 is enacted last. The Assembly amendments also make related changes to the legislative findings.

SB 455, as it passed the Senate, among other things, required a transferor mortgage servicer servicing a mortgage secured by property, as defined, within the geographic limits of a proclaimed state of emergency or local emergency to deliver to a transferee mortgage servicer any material written records between the borrower and the mortgage servicer relating to the repair of property that suffered a total loss due to damage caused by a natural disaster for which the state of emergency or local emergency was proclaimed.

The Assembly amendments instead require that delivery to be of material records relating to the borrower's election to use insurance proceeds to repair or replace property damaged by a disaster for which the state of emergency or local emergency was proclaimed. The Assembly amendments additionally specify that the bill shall not be interpreted to prohibit a mortgage servicer from delivering to a transferee mortgage servicer any material written records relating to a borrower's election to use insurance proceeds to repair or replace damaged property that was not caused by a disaster for which a state of emergency or local emergency was proclaimed.

SB 639, as it passed the Senate, made legislative findings relating to the impacts and treatment of Alzheimer's disease and dementia, and encouraging the establishment of diagnostic hubs for Alzheimer's disease for training of health care professionals and securing access to therapies. SB 639, as it passed the Senate, authorized the diagnostic hubs to collaborate with relevant state departments for expertise.

The Assembly amendments revise provisions relating to grants to postsecondary higher educational institutions that establish diagnostic and treatment centers for Alzheimer's disease, making conforming changes referring to diagnostic hubs. The Assembly amendments expand the purposes of the diagnostic hubs, including collaboration with the State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) in promoting the Dementia Care Aware initiative and in continuing the department's cognitive health assessment training. The Assembly amendments require a state department or diagnostic hub to obtain certain approval from DHCS to host any Dementia Care Aware materials on internet websites. The Assembly amendments make additional changes to a related Medi-Cal provision.

SB 432, as it passed the Senate, revised provisions of law concerning the State Teachers' Retirement System (STRS) to specify that compensation reported in accordance with STRS rules includes rules relating to timeliness and accuracy and eliminated the requirement that supersession by other law or order be express. SB 432, as it passed the Senate, required that notice of determination of an error in compensation reported to STRS be provided in writing and based on the law applicable at the time that the compensation was reported. SB 432, as it passed the Senate, also required that amounts overpaid resulting from compensation determined to have been paid to enhance a member's benefits be recovered from the member, participant, former participant, or beneficiary receiving the allowance or annuity benefit, or the employer, or both.

The Assembly amendments delete the above-described requirement that notice of a determination of error be provided in writing, based on the law applicable at the time the compensation was reported. The Assembly amendments also delete the provision that required amounts overpaid due to compensation paid to enhance a member's benefits be recovered. The Assembly amendments also require STRS to identify and provide resources on its internet website that interpret compensation and creditable service laws. The Assembly amendments further require those STRS-identified resources to be relied upon for purposes of audits or other actions by STRS unless the resource is revoked or superseded by STRS. The Assembly amendments provide that if STRS determines that compensation reported in accordance with its identified resources has been reported in error as a result of an error in those resources, the resulting overpayment to the individual member, former member, or beneficiary would be deemed an error of STRS and subject to a specified recovery process. The Assembly amendments make various other changes to the Teachers' Retirement Law, including allowing for a retroactive interpretation of law if it is the result of a final court order.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 669, as it passed the Senate, authorized a veterinarian to allow a registered veterinary technician to act as an agent of the veterinarian for the purpose of establishing the veterinarian-client-patient relationship to administer preventive or prophylactic vaccines or medications for the control or eradication of apparent or anticipated internal or external parasites by satisfying specified criteria, including, among others, a requirement that, if the registered veterinary technician is working at a location other than a registered veterinary premises, the veterinarian is in the general vicinity.

The Assembly amendments would instead require, if the registered veterinarian technician is working at a location other than a registered veterinary premises, that the veterinarian is in the general vicinity or is available by telephone and is quickly and easily available, and that the location has equipment and drugs necessary to provide emergency care, as specified. The Assembly amendments would additionally require the registered veterinary technician, at any location, to inform the client that the registered veterinary technician is acting as an agent of the veterinarian and to record the client's authorization to proceed in the animal patient's medical record.

SB 706, as it passed the Senate, until January 1, 2030, expanded existing progressive design-build provisions relating to water storage, supply, treatment, and distribution facilities to authorize cities, counties, city and counties, or special districts to use the progressive design-build process for up to 15 public works projects in excess of \$5,000,000 for each project, unlimited as to the type of project.

The Assembly amendments delete those provisions, and instead authorize, until January 1, 2030, use of the progressive design-build process for up to 10 additional public works in excess of \$5,000,000 for each project, excluding projects on state-owned or state-operated facilities.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 808, as it passed the Senate, made legislative findings and declarations and required rules adopted by the Trustees of the California State University pursuant to specified provisions to, among other things, (1) require each campus president and either a vice president or vice chancellor to approve all sexual harassment settlements, (2) require a report to the chancellor's office and the Legislature on the number of sexual harassment complaints filed, the length of time taken to complete the investigative process, and the disposition of those cases, as specified, and (3) prohibit the opportunity to retreat for specified employees who have been determined, as provided, to have committed sexual harassment or have violated the California State University Title IX, as defined, sexual harassment policy.

The Assembly amendments delete the contents of SB 808, except for the legislative findings and declarations, and instead require the California State University, on or before December 1 of each year, to submit a report to the Legislature on the investigations and outcomes of sexual harassment reports and formal sexual harassment complaints, as provided, and require the California State University to post these annual reports on its internet website.

The Assembly amendments additionally conform specified provisions relating to the release of parolees to current parole processes, change the annual date, from September 15 to October 15, of the California Rehabilitation Oversight Board's report on the various mental health, substance abuse, educational, and employment programs for incarcerated persons and parolees, and require, if electronic monitoring is imposed on specified individuals for a period of greater than 30 days, the court to hold a hearing at least once every 30 days instead of holding that hearing every 30 days.
