Additionally, this position falls under the direction and oversight of the Director of Conservation, a gubernatorial appointee that is subject to Senate confirmation.

SB 389, it passed the Senate, authorized, upon specified findings, the State Water Resources Control Board to investigate the diversion and use of water from a stream system to determine whether the diversion and use are based upon appropriation, riparian right, or other basis of right, as specified, and authorized the state board to adopt regulations to implement these provisions.

The Assembly amendments instead authorize the board to investigate and ascertain whether or not a water right is valid and authorize the board to issue an information order in furtherance of an investigation, as executed by the executive director of the board, as specified. The Assembly amendments further authorize a diversion or use of water ascertained to be unauthorized to be enforced as a trespass, as specified.

The Assembly amendments revise the requirement that the schoolbus be electric to require that the schoolbus be zero-emission. The Assembly amendments also authorize the signage to specify the fuel type of the zero-emission schoolbus.

The bill prohibited the commission from pursuing administrative action against a person if they completed the political reform education program.

The Assembly amendments instead provide that a person who meets the requirements of the above-described program, and completes it, is exempt from administrative, civil, or criminal penalties for the applicable violation of the Political Reform Act of 1974.

SB 68, as it passed the Senate, authorized the Department of the California Highway Patrol to, by regulation, allow a driver of a tank vehicle with a capacity of more than 500 gallons transporting flammable liquid to exceed the maximum driving time of 10 hours in a work period during a declared state of emergency if transporting aircraft fuel used for refueling aircraft used in fire suppression or other emergency-related activities, as specified.

The Assembly amendments authorize the department to additionally allow a driver to be exempt from the prohibition against driving any period after having been on duty for 80 hours in any consecutive 8 days in the circumstances described above and makes the provisions applicable to the transport of other fuel types used in emergency-related activities, including fire suppression.

The Assembly amendments incorporate the changes made by AB 1361, with those incorporated changes to take effect only if both bills are chaptered and this bill is chaptered last.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 773, as it passed the Senate, for purposes of determining the family's total monthly household income for the permanent housing assistance under the Cal-WORKs program, authorized a county human services agency to include any amount that is regularly received from other government and nonprofit housing and homeless subsidy programs and any regularly received private support intended or designed to help the family with housing. SB 773, as it passed the Senate, required the county to, upon issuing the first payment of temporary homeless assistance, refer the assistance unit to any other homeless assistance services provided under the CalWORKs program and to give priority to the assistance unit for those services. SB 773, as it passed the Senate, required the State Department of Social Services to collect statewide data regarding the homeless assistance, and establish a statewide stakeholder advisory group, or modify the responsibilities of an existing advisory group, to develop recommendations regarding the homeless assistance.

The Assembly amendments require, instead of authorize, the county human services agency to include the above-described funds when determining the family's total monthly household income for the permanent housing assistance, and specify that those funds may include financial support from an individual outside the household. The Assembly amendments additionally require a county to refer an assistance unit to other applicable housing programs, as specified, upon application for temporary or permanent homeless assistance, and authorize, instead of require, the county to give priority to the assistance unit for the CalWORKs services they may be referred to. The Assembly amendments additionally require the department to collect the race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, and gender identity of the applicants, and require the stakeholder advisory group to include demographic diversity that reflects the diverse population of families experiencing homelessness. The Assembly amendments also make the bill's provisions operative beginning January 1, 2025, or on the date that the department notifies the Legislature that the California Statewide Automated Welfare System can perform the necessary automation to implement its provisions.

An act relating to employment, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 332, as it passed the Senate, required the Department of Industrial Relations to evaluate the effectiveness of the existing law requirement that a school district or school notify each apprenticeship program in the same county as the school district or school of a career or college fair it is planning to hold, as specified. SB 332, as it passed the Senate, also required the Department to submit, by January 1, 2026, a report making recommendations to the Legislature on how to improve outreach to high school students regarding apprenticeship and preapprenticeship opportunities, as well as ways to expand preapprenticeships and incentivize businesses to offer them.

The Assembly amendments delete those provisions and instead make specified provisions of the Labor Code inapplicable to a person who is covered by a contract to play baseball at the minor league level with a labor organization that has at least 10 years of experience representing baseball players and who is compensated pursuant to the terms of a valid collective bargaining agreement that expressly provides for the wages, hours of work, working conditions of employees, payment for time worked during the off-season and spring training, and final and binding arbitration of disputes. The Assembly amendments require the Department of Industrial Relations to amend and republish Wage Order No. 10-2001 to provide that specified provisions of the wage order do not apply to a person subject to these provisions.

The Assembly amendments provide that an itemized wage statement furnished by an employer pursuant to these provisions is not required to show total hours worked by an employee if the employee is exempt from the payment of minimum wage and overtime under the these provisions. The Assembly amendments also declare that the measure is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 335, as it passed the Senate, required the Department of Industrial Relations to submit the annual report that the department publishes containing statistics on state work injuries and occupational diseases and fatalities to the Legislature and the Governor.

The Assembly amendments deleted these provisions from the bill and instead authorize the County of Santa Clara to impose a transactions and use tax for general or specific purposes at a rate of no more than 0.625% that, in combination with other transactions and use taxes, would exceed the combined rate limit for all taxes that may be imposed in accordance with the Transactions and Use Tax Law of 2%. The amendments require any transactions and use tax adopted pursuant to their provisions to satisfy specified conditions, and repeal the authorization to impose such tax if no ordinance is approved by December 31, 2028.

The Assembly amendments also reframed the existing authority for the Ventura County Transportation Commission to impose a transactions and use tax for the support of countywide transportation programs to instead authorize the County of Ventura to impose that transactions and use tax.

An act relating to water.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 3, as passed by the Senate, required the State Water Resources Control Board to, upon appropriation by the Legislature, expend moneys to provide training statewide to community water systems with between 15 and 200 service connections to meet compliance with the Water Shutoff Protection Act.

The Assembly amendments, among other things, instead expand the use of available funds in the Safe Drinking Water Account to be used by the state board, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to include the administration of the Water Shutoff Protection Act and subject to the availability of funding, require the state board to make funds available for providing training statewide to community water systems with between 15 and 200 service connections to assist in compliance with the Water Shutoff Protection Act. The Assembly amendments also authorize, as part of the act, the Attorney General, at the request of the board or upon the Attorney General's own motion, to bring an action in state court to restore to any person in interest any money or property, real or personal, that may have been acquired by any method, act, or practice prohibited by the act.

An act relating to housing.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 4, as it passed the Senate, required that a housing development project located on land owned by an independent institution of higher education or a religious institution be a use by right if certain requirements are met, established location, affordability, and other criteria required to be satisfied, and defined specified terms for purposes of those provisions.

The Assembly amendments, among other changes, repeal the bill's provisions on January 1, 2036. The Assembly amendments include additional location and other criteria required to be satisfied for a housing development project to be a use by right, including that housing units on the site not be within a specified distance of certain industrial sites or a facility that actively extracts or refines oil or natural gas and that, if the site of the development is a vacant site, it does not contain tribal cultural resources that could be affected by the development, as specified. The Assembly amendments specify that the bill's provisions do not prevent a development from also qualifying as a housing development project entitled to the protections of the Housing Accountability Act. The Assembly amendments also make related revisions to the bill's definitions and add coauthors.

The Assembly amendments instead authorize a person to seek an order requiring a social media platform to remove content that includes an offer to transport, import into this state, sell, furnish, administer, or give away a specified controlled substance.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 77, as it passed the Senate, required an elections official to notify a vote by mail voter by telephone, a text message, or email, if the elections official has a telephone number or email address for the voter on file, if the elections official determined that the signature on a vote by mail ballot did not match the voter's signature appearing on a specified voter registration record or if the identification envelope did not contain a signature to allow the voter the opportunity to verify their signature.

The Assembly amendments further require the elections official to attempt to leave a voicemail message if the elections official calls the voter and the voter does not answer. The Assembly amendments authorize an elections official to use contact information provided on a voter's affidavit of registration for purposes of comparing and verifying signatures for vote by mail ballots. The Assembly amendments also incorporate additional changes to Section 3019 of the Elections Code proposed by AB 1037, to be operative only if this bill and AB 1037 are enacted and this bill is enacted last.

An act relating to historic venues, and making an appropriation therefor.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 96, as it passed the Senate, among other things, required a return filed with the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration to report gross receipts for sales tax purposes to segregate the taxable sales on a line or a separate form, as prescribed by the department, if the place of sale in this state is on or within the real property of a historic venue on the day of a qualified event, as defined. SB 96, as it passed the Senate, required the Controller, based on allocation reports from the department, to transmit as promptly as feasible all revenues, less refunds and specified costs, derived from certain sales and use taxes on the sale of tangible personal property during a qualified event, as defined, to the city, county, or city and county that identified the confirmed historic venue, at which the qualified event occurred, to the department and in which the qualified event from which the revenues derive occurred.

The Assembly amendments remove the above requirement on the Controller and instead, until July 1, 2030, create the Historic Venue Restoration and Resiliency Fund and continuously appropriate the moneys in the fund for transmission by the Controller to cities and counties with historic venues, as specified. The Assembly amendments define "county" to mean the County of Alameda, the County of Santa Clara, and the County of Los Angeles and define "city" to mean a city within the geographic boundaries of any of those counties.

The Assembly amendments also require the department to report the amount of the total gross receipts segregated on the returns filed for the prior fiscal year to the Department of Finance on or before November 1 of each year, as prescribed. The Assembly amendments require an amount equal to 5% of the total amount of gross receipts, or adjusted gross receipts, for the prior fiscal year reported to the Department of Finance by the department to be included in the next annual Governor's Budget for deposit into the fund. The Assembly amendments require, no later than 30 days after the enactment of the annual Budget Act, the amount appropriated by the Legislature to the Controller, as described above, to be transferred by the Controller to the fund. The Assembly amendments also require, on or before January 1, 2027, and annually thereafter, a city or county that receives money from the fund to deliver a report to the department regarding how that money

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 235, as it passed the Senate, required parties in a civil action to provide initial disclosures of specified information unless modified by a court order upon stipulation of the parties.

The Assembly amendments instead require that each party in a civil action provide disclosures within 60 days of a demand made by any party in the action, unless modified by the stipulation of all parties. The Assembly amendments require initial disclosures to include information relevant to the subject matter of the action and contractual agreements and insurance policies related to persons or entities who may be liable to satisfy a judgment. The Assembly amendments permit a party to propound a supplemental demand in specified circumstances and exempt specified proceedings from the requirement to provide initial disclosures. The Assembly amendments apply the provisions of the bill only to civil actions filed on or after January 1, 2024, and repeal these provisions on January 1, 2027.

An act relating to tidelands and submerged lands.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 273, as it passed the Senate, established the Pier 30-32 Reconstruction Act. The bill, as it passed the Senate, revised the conditions relating to the approval of mixed-use development on the San Francisco waterfront at Pier 30-32 by the State Lands Commission, to include, among other things, that mixed-use development comply with specified provisions.

The Assembly amendments include, as part of these specified provisions, the requirement that the City and County of San Francisco acting by and through the San Francisco Port Commission and its selected developer offer a range of equity-based programs, as provided, and that the mixed-use development not contain residential use.

The bill, as it passed the Senate, included findings and declarations that specified laws concerning the water-oriented use criterion and no alternative upland location criterion shall not apply to a mixed-use project on Pier 30-32, as provided.

The Assembly amendments provide, except as otherwise specified, that the authority or discretion of the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission to approve or deny permits for those aspects of a mixed-use development on Pier 30-32 in a manner otherwise consistent with specified laws and plans is not limited by the provisions of the act.

The bill, as it passed the Senate, updated the findings and declarations relating to the history of the San Francisco waterfront and Pier 30-32.

The Assembly amendments make additional changes to these findings and declarations.

The Assembly amendments, also make various nonsubstantive and technical changes.

An act relating to special education.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 354, as it passed the Senate, among other things, required the Commission on Teacher Credentialing to, on or before January 1, 2025, revise its administrative services credential standards and performance expectations to include and strengthen preparation for inclusion, with a focus on, among other things, universal design for learning (UDL) and required administrator preparation programs to ensure faculty are prepared in, among other things, UDL and inclusive practices. SB 354, as it passed the Senate, required, contingent upon an appropriation, the State Department of Education to, on or before March 31, 2025, develop and disseminate joint guidance clarifying the ways in which inclusive classrooms and placements may be staffed under current law, as provided, and required the department to, on or before March 31, 2025, submit a report to the Legislature on recommendations for statutory or regulatory changes necessary to eliminate barriers to the staffing of inclusive placements, as provided.

The Assembly amendments change the date by which the commission is required to revise the administrative services credential standards and performance expectations described above from January 1, 2025, to instead be June 30, 2025. The Assembly amendments change the date by which the department is required to develop and disseminate joint guidance clarifying the ways in which inclusive classrooms and placements may be staffed from March 31, 2025, to instead be March 31, 2027. The amendments change the date by which the department is required to submit a report to the Legislature on recommendations for statutory or regulatory changes necessary to eliminate barriers to the staffing of inclusive placements from March 31, 2025, to instead be March 31, 2026, make conforming changes, and make the requirement to provide that report contingent upon appropriation by the Legislature.

An act relating to data collection.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 435, as it passed the Senate, required the State Department of Social Services to use separate collection categories and tabulations for specified Latino groups, Mesoamerican Indigenous nations, and Mesoamerican Indigenous language groups when collecting demographic data regarding the ancestry or ethnic origin of California residents for any CalFresh program report. SB 435, as it passed the Senate, required the department to include specified data in every demographic report on the ancestry or ethnic origins of California residents that the department published or released on or after July 1, 2025, and required the department to report to the Legislature on the data collection and methods used on or before July 1, 2025, and annually thereafter. SB 435 required the department to comply with these requirements as early as possible, but no later than July 1, 2025, and required the State Department of Public Health to comply with these requirements on or after January 1, 2024, as specified.

The Assembly amendments extend each of the above-described deadlines by 2 years to 2027 and 2026, as applicable, and specify additional categories of major Latino groups for the department to use in the collection of demographic data.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 439, as it passed the Senate, required a court adjudicating a special motion to strike a pleading in an action challenging the approval or permitting of a priority housing development project to consider the pleadings and supporting an opposition affidavits for the motion to strike when making its determination. SB 439, as it passed the Senate, defined a priority housing development as a development in which 100% of the units, exclusive of manager's units, would be reserved for lower income households.

The Assembly amendments require the court to make its determination based on the pleadings and affidavits, and permit requests for judicial notice to be included in those affidavits. In cases where the court determines that an administrative record is required to make its decision, the Assembly amendments would permit the moving party to file a special motion to strike after the administrative record is available, as specified. The Assembly amendments specify that, to qualify as a priority housing development, all units, as specified, must be reserved for lower income households for at least 55 years.

The Assembly amendments added, and then subsequently deleted, a requirement that the form provide options for describing the change of circumstances that necessitates a modification of the restraining order. Because subsequent amendments in the Assembly delete that provision, SB 459 passed in the Assembly in the same form as it passed in the Senate.

An act relating to criminal law.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 464, as it passed the Senate, gave a victim of sexual assault the right to have a licensed attorney representing the victim present at any interview by law enforcement authorities, district attorneys, or defense attorneys, as specified.

The Assembly amendments remove those provisions.

SB 464, as it passed the Senate, required the prosecuting attorney, upon the request of a victim or witness of a crime, to inform the victim or witness by letter of the final disposition of the case within 72 hours.

The Assembly amendments instead require the prosecuting attorney to give that notice of the final disposition of the case within 30 days.

SB 464, as it passed the Senate, required specified entities that receive, maintain, store, or preserve sexual assault evidence kits to conduct an audit of all untested sexual assault evidence kits in their possession, as specified.

The Assembly amendments, among other things, require each law enforcement agency and public crime laboratory to create a record in the SAFE-T database for every victim sexual assault kit that has not had DNA testing completed, and require each medical facility and other non-law enforcement entity to report specified data relating to untested kits, as specified. The amendments additionally authorize a victim to request that a kit collected from them not be tested, and would exempt that kit from being tested. The Assembly amendments exempt suspect test kits from the requirement that a SAFE-T database entry be created, but do require those kits to be included in the audit.

The Assembly amendments specify additional projects eligible for funding by both programs, upon appropriation, that provide benefits in addition to drought relief, including, but not limited to, projects that provide water deliveries, projects that construct water infrastructure, and projects that rescue, protect, and relocate fish and wildlife. The Assembly amendments also specify that projects that support water conservation activities are eligible for funding by the Urban Water Community Drought Relief program.

SB 487, as it passed the Senate, prohibited a contract issued, amended, or renewed on or after January 1, 2024, between a health care service plan or health insurer and a health care services provider from containing a term that would result in termination or nonrenewal of the contract or otherwise penalize the provider based on a civil judgment, criminal conviction, or another professional disciplinary action in another state if the judgment, conviction, or professional disciplinary action is based on the application of another state's laws that interfere with a person's right to receive care that would be lawful if provided in California. SB 487, as it passed the Senate, also prohibited discrimination with respect to the provision of, or contracts for, professional services against a licensed provider solely based on the same criteria. SB 487, as it passed the Senate, prohibited the department from suspending an individual or entity as a Medi-Cal provider if the revocation, suspension, loss, or surrender of the individual or entity's license, certification, or approval authority in another state is based solely on conduct that is not prohibited in California.

The Assembly amendments, instead, give the department the authority to elect not to suspend an individual or entity as a provider in the Medi-Cal program if the revocation, suspension, loss, or surrender of the individual or entity's license, certification, or approval authority in another state is based on conduct that is not deemed to be unprofessional conduct under California law. The Assembly amendments require the department to seek any federal approvals it deems necessary to implement this requirement and mandates the requirement only be implemented to the extent the department obtains necessary federal approvals and federal financial participation under the Medi-Cal program is available and not otherwise jeopardized. The Assembly amendments authorize the department to implement or interpret this requirement through plan or county letters, information notices, plan or provider bulletins, or similar written instructions.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 541, as it passed the Senate, among other things, required each public school, as defined, to, on or before the start of the 2024–25 school year, make internal and external condoms available to all pupils in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, free of charge. SB 541, as it passed the Senate, required these public schools to distribute condoms in a specified manner, including, among other things, by requiring condoms placed in locations not regularly supervised by school staff to be stored in tamper-proof dispensers. SB 541, as it passed the Senate, required these public schools to post at least one notice containing certain information, including, among other information, certain language from SB 541. SB 541, as it passed the Senate, required each public school serving any of grades 7 to 12, inclusive, to allow the distribution of condoms during the course of, or in connection with, educational or public health programs and initiatives. SB 541, as it passed the Senate, defined "public school" for these purposes to include a school operated by a school district, a school operated by a county office of education, and a charter school.

The Assembly amendments, among other things, remove the above-described requirement regarding tamper-proof dispensers and the requirement that the above-mentioned notice contain certain language from SB 541. The Assembly amendments require a public school to, upon request, provide this notice in an accessible format, as provided. The Assembly amendments require each public school serving any of grades 7 to 12, inclusive, to allow condoms to be made available, rather than distributed, during the course of, or in connection with, educational or public health programs and initiatives. The Assembly amendments additionally include state special schools within the definition of "public school" for these purposes.

SB 541, as it passed the Senate, added to the list of comprehensive clinical family planning services under the Family PACT Program coverage for immunization against human papillomavirus, as clinically indicated, to persons who are between 12 and 18 years of age, inclusive, at Family PACT provider sites that are not enrolled in the federally funded Vaccines for Children Program that is administered by the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, as specified.

The Assembly amendments remove the above-described immunization-related provisions.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 619, as it passed the Senate, authorized the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (Energy Commission), when evaluating applications for the certification of certain eligible electrical transmission facilities, to consider whether an applicant certifies that a capital investment of at least \$250,000,000 will be made over a period of 5 years.

The Assembly amendments delete those provisions and instead authorize an electrical corporation that files an application with the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) to authorize the new construction of any electrical transmission facility to simultaneously submit to the Energy Commission an application for certification of the facility as an environmental leadership development project, as specified. The Assembly amendments, among other things, provide that the Energy Commission's certification of a facility proposed by an electrical corporation satisfies and replaces the PUC's obligations under CEQA with respect to that facility. The Assembly amendments also require an applicant applying for certification of an electrical transmission project to take certain actions, including, among other actions, to avoid or minimize significant environmental impacts in any disadvantaged community.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 644, as it passed the Senate, required a hotel, third-party booking service, hosting platform, and short-term rental, as defined, to allow a reservation to be canceled without penalty for at least 24 hours after the reservation is confirmed if the reservation is made 24 hours or more before the day of check-in, as specified, and exempted from its provisions a reservation booked by a third party on behalf of a consumer pursuant to a contract between the third party and the hosting platform, hotel, third-party booking service, or short-term rental.

The Assembly amendments instead require a hotel, third-party booking service, hosting platform, and short-term rental allow a reservation for a hotel accommodation or a short-term rental located in California to be canceled without penalty for at least 24 hours after the reservation is confirmed if the reservation is made 72 hours or more before the time of check-in and exempt from the bill a reservation that meets certain criteria, including that the reservation was made for a negotiated rate that was not advertised, or otherwise made available, for booking by the general public.

The Assembly amendments specify that such an employee shall be deemed an employee of a school district in the County of Shasta or an employee of the Shasta County Office of Education. The Assembly amendments also add an urgency clause in order for the bill to take immediate effect, thereby increasing the bill's vote threshold from majority to 23.

SB 657, as it passed the Senate, required the California Interagency Council on Homelessness to coordinate with the California continuums of care and the area agencies on aging to partner in their shared regions to provide gerontological training for homelessness services staff to ensure that homelessness service providers are well trained and well equipped to assist vulnerable older adults with accessing resources to gain a permanent housing solution.

The Assembly amendments delete those provisions and instead require the council to coordinate with the California Department of Aging, the California continuums of care, and the area agencies on aging to convene a working group to develop recommendations on best practices for assisting older adults to prevent and overcome homelessness and to develop a training for those who assist older adults with housing needs. The Assembly amendments require the council, on or before March 1, 2025, to report on the recommendations to specified legislative committees.

Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 696, as it passed the Senate, authorized a notary public or an applicant for appointment as a notary public to apply for registration with the Secretary of State as a notary public authorized to perform online notarizations. SB 696, as it passed the Senate, imposed various requirements on a notary public authorized to perform online notarizations, on online notarization platforms, and on the Secretary of State related to online notarization, including, among other things, requiring the Secretary of State to complete the technology necessary to implement online notarization by January 1, 2030, and to provide custodial services for electronic journals and audio-video recordings of online notarial acts.

The Assembly amendments make various changes relating to documentation of online notarial acts, including, among other things, requiring an online notary public to keep a tangible journal in addition to an electronic journal and to take all necessary measures to disable the electronic affixation of the notary public's electronic signature or seal. The Assembly amendments remove the above-described custodial requirements on the Secretary of State and instead require a notary public to retain their electronic journal and audio-video recordings for at least 10 years after the end of their commission, as specified, and prohibit an online notarization system or depository from deleting a journal entry or audio-video recording until the notary public is given a reasonable opportunity to download the journal or recording. The Assembly amendments make use of a platform or depository not in compliance with specified requirements grounds for revocation or suspension of commission as a notary public.

The Assembly amendments additionally create an exception to the above-described January 1, 2030, deadline if the Secretary of State notifies the Governor and Legislature on or before January 1, 2029, that the technology project is incomplete. The Assembly amendments also require an applicant for commission as a notary public to perform online notarizations to complete a course of study specific to online notarization and impose maximum fees on online notarial services. The Assembly amendments additionally impose various requirements on a business that provides a software platform that enables the performance of a remote online notarial act, including requiring the business to consent to the jurisdiction of the

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courts in this state and to create an encrypted journal entry and audio-video recording for a notarial act performed using the platform. The Assembly amendments create a cause of action against a business who violates those provisions.

The Assembly amendments revise the above-described requirement to instead apply to local educational agencies maintaining any combination of classes from grades 1 to 12, inclusive, and only to those schoolsites that meet specified criteria and delays the requirement by one year to instead be on or before July 1, 2026. The Assembly amendments additionally revise the conditions under which a public or private school maintaining any combination of classes from kindergarten to grade 12, inclusive, is authorized to temporarily close any restroom. The Assembly amendments additionally require certain modernization projects submitted by the governing board of a school district, a county board of education, or the governing body of a charter school for approval on or after July 1, 2026, to include, as part of the modernization project, an all-gender restroom, as provided.

The Assembly amendments additionally make the landowner or water right holder proposing a modification or replacement of a conduit liable for any damage to a private landowner's property that may occur during the replacement or modification.

The Assembly amendments, among other things, (1) revise the purposes of the conservancy, as specified, (2) revise the membership of the conservancy's board of directors, as provided, (3) require the conservancy to be governed by a board of directors by January 1, 2026, (4) require the board of directors to prepare and adopt a strategic plan to achieve the goals of the conservancy, as provided, (5) revise certain powers and duties of the conservancy, and (6) make moneys in the Salton Sea Conservancy Fund, including authorized proceeds from the sale of bonds and allocations from the Salton Sea Lithium Fund, available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, for purposes of the conservancy.

SB 659 required the department to consult with the State Water Resources Control Board, the 9 regional water quality control boards, and the advisory committee established to assist the department in the updating of The California Water Plan in carrying out these provisions. SB 659 allowed the department to add members from specified fields to the advisory committee, as provided. SB 659 required the groundwater recharge action plan to identify and make recommendations on immediate opportunities and potential long-term solutions to increase the state's groundwater supply, as specified. SB 659 required the department to include the groundwater recharge action plan as part of the 2028 update to The California Water Plan and to update the groundwater recharge action plan at the same time that the department prepares updates to The California Water Plan. SB 659 required the department and the water boards, upon an appropriation or further action by the Legislature, to implement the recommendations identified in the groundwater recharge action plan that result in new infrastructure and institutional mechanisms in place that provide for the ability to create additional groundwater capacity. SB 659 required a portion of hearings the department is required to conduct in the updating of The California Water Plan to be conducted in regions of the state that have been impacted the most by drought, as specified.

The Assembly amendments remove the requirement that the department develop a groundwater recharge action plan, instead requiring that the department provide actionable recommendations to develop additional groundwater recharge opportunities that increase the recharge of the state's groundwater basins as part of the 2028 update to The California Water Plan, and each subsequent update thereafter. The Assembly amendments require the recommendations to contain additional information, including a discussion on possible incentives that could support the development of recharge projects and an estimate of the volume of recharge that could potentially be realized. The Assembly amendments delete the requirement that the

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recommendations be implemented by the department and water boards upon an appropriation or further action by the Legislature, as well as the requirement that a portion of the hearings described above be conducted in regions of the state that have been impacted the most by drought.
