Additionally, this position falls under the direction and oversight of the Director of Conservation, a gubernatorial appointee that is subject to Senate confirmation.

For these reasons, I am returning this bill without my signature.

The amendments change the date by which the department is required to submit a report to the Legislature on recommendations for statutory or regulatory changes necessary to eliminate barriers to the staffing of inclusive placements from March 31, 2025, to instead be March 31, 2026, make conforming changes, and make the requirement to provide that report contingent upon appropriation by the Legislature.

The Assembly amendments make an election to separate a joint contract under the above-described circumstances irrevocable and, upon separation of the joint contract, make a county and trial court ineligible to reestablish a joint contract. The Assembly amendments also revise the above-described provisions requiring the board to perform a separate computation of the assets and liabilities to specify that this computation is to occur upon request and not to exceed once every five years in accordance with specified procedures. The Assembly amendments make various other conforming changes, including revising the timeframe for separating a joint contract.
