#### Legislative Counsel's Digest of Assembly Amendments

SB 263, as it passed the Senate, required, beginning January 1, 2025, insurance producers to act in the best interest of the consumer when making a recommendation of an annuity, required insurers to establish, maintain, and utilize a system to supervise recommendations for annuities, as specified, set forth various duties of an insurer and producer to ensure that recommended annuities are only in the consumer's best interest, and specified obligations that ensure a producer has acted in the best interest of a consumer.

The Assembly amendments apply the above provisions to the sales or recommendations of annuities made on or after January 1, 2025, and authorize the Insurance Commissioner to require certain actions by, and impose sanctions and penalties on, insurers and their agents for a violation of these provisions. The Assembly amendments also limit the application of current statutes regulating annuities, as specified, to (1) a recommendation of an annuity made before January 1, 2025, that results in the purchase, exchange, or replacement that was recommended and (2) a sale of an annuity made before January 1, 2025, that is not based on a recommendation.

SB 263, as it passed the Senate, required a life agent who engages in the sale of life insurance policies on or after January 1, 2025, to complete specified hours of life insurance training courses before soliciting consumers to sell life insurance policies or renewing their license, and required an insurance producer to complete an annuity training course before transacting annuities on or after January 1, 2025.

The Assembly amendments require a life agent, licensed on or after January 1, 2024, who engages in the sale of specified life insurance policies on or after January 1, 2025, to complete the above-mentioned specified hours of life insurance training courses, require any life agent, who engages in the sale of variable life insurance policies, to complete specified hours of training before renewing their license, and apply these training provisions to licenses that are issued or renewed on or after January 1, 2025. The Assembly amendments require producers, who hold a life insurance line of authority, as specified, and who desire to sell annuities, to complete an annuity training program, as specified.
